These facilities should be outsourced to the private sector, specifically churches, as we know that it is a change of heart that leads to changes in a man's life. The Christian Churches have successfully provided similar services for generations. Also, when these facilities are under the charge of a trustworthy pastor, the community can feel more secure that they are being run in a proper form.
