Question 2. How could the Highway District be improved? Please provide your top 2-3 ideas.	1 – Impact fees on new homes 2 – Franchise fees on utilities in our rights-of-way 3 – Better state funding for roads	The East Side Highway District maintains 242 miles of road, in 47% of those roads remain to be gravel. Most of roads remain at a 10 roads surface life. The following are my recommendations: A. The ESHD needs to seek alternative funding sources through State and Federal Funding to assist bringing the graveled roads up to Highway District Standards. B. Let new development pay for itself without putting the burden on taxpayers. C. The Idaho Codes under budgeting need to be rewritten to support new growth. 7. Do you believe the highway district should be acquiring land to expand the existing road system? What areas do you believe need to be expanded?	- We preserved Boothe Park for public access but it is not our job to acquire land. Developers must provide infrastructure.	As is stand today, the East Side Highway District has limited funds needed for road and bridge improvements. I cannot foresee the District acquiring land to expand their existing infrastructure. It is the associated Highway District Standards that they will not accept any additional roads in to their jurisdiction, unless the roads are built up to Highway District Standards.	I do not believe the Highway District should acquire land to expand the existing road system. I do think there are some areas that need improvement, but road maintenance has a continuous cycle and not all areas can be addressed every year.
8. Under what conditions do you believe the Highway District should recommend the utilization of eminent domain and why?	- Almost never. Only if a road project that benefits thousands of motorists, and only as a last resort.	I believe you should consider eminent domain with public approval, in areas of unsafe and high traffic areas. I believe this is where you should consider eminent domain at a fair market value.	I do not believe in eminent domain. It would have to be an extreme public safety and even then, I would hope other solutions could be found.

I am on the board of the KMPO and work with all other agencies to provide better roads.
