1. What is your name, what office are you running for and why are you running for this position?	Declined to Respond	My name is David J. Reilly, and I am running to become the zone 5 trustee for Post Falls School Board. I am running because I believe that our public education system has been broken because of the implementation of things like Common Core and Critical Race Theory. According to idahoschools.org, Post Falls school district only has a 44.9% "reading proficiency" which is absolutely unacceptable, and proof that these new curricula don't work. As your trustee, I'm going to everything in my power to restore sanity to our school district, and make sure that parents regain control of their children's education.
2. How could your school district be improved? Please provide your top 2-3 ideas.	Declined to Respond	We will improve the Post Falls School District by removing any and all Common Core, Critical Race Theory, Social Emotional Learning and Diversity Equity & Inclusion programs and policies. 4. Do you support "Critical Race Theory," why or why not?	Declined to Respond	I do not support Critical Race Theory because it teaches students to hold one another in derision based on their race. Curriculum based on CRT teaches students to view White children with contempt, for certain perceived wrongs, while at the same time teaching non-White students that they should not even try to excel in the classroom because they will be "held down," regardless of their individual effort, by a fictitious "White supremacist society."
