Not only does the Committee oversee all federal revenue and tax policies, but it also has jurisdiction over health care entitlement programs (Medicare, Medicaid, CHIPS, Obamacare), which account for about two-thirds of the federal government spending. Much of the spending on these programs is on ever-increasing autopilot. These together make them the most significant part of our national fiscal crisis. This will put me in the position to lead on reforming not only our tax code to make our economy more competitive, but also controlling our entitlement spending. pay too much,	American pay way too much in taxes – Yes lower taxes for ALL taxpayers	We need to reduce taxes further and stop the massive tax increases proposed by the Biden Administration. One of my underlying goals when I first came to Congress was to find ways to revise our tax code so that hardworking Idahoans could have more of their paychecks in their pockets rather than with the federal government. Our tax code has been more unfair, more complex, more costly to comply with and more anti-competitive for American businesses than any previous tax code. Consumers end up paying for such a tax code because businesses often pass those costs along to their clients. Throughout my service on the Simpson-Bowles Commission and the Senate Finance Committee, I consistently pushed for comprehensive reform of our tax code that would address all of these issues. Tax reform as been one of my highest priorities and I was part of crafting one of the most comprehensive reforms of our tax code, the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) of 2017. It provided tax relief across the board, but specifically to individuals and small businesses. TCJA lowered individual tax rates, nearly doubled the standard deduction, and doubled the child tax credit from \$1,000 to \$2,000. According to the Congressional Budget Office, three out of every four dollars in tax cuts went directly to individuals. Due to the TCJA, six million of the most vulnerable taxpayers saw their tax burden drop to zero. The TCJA gives Americans access to higher wages and greater job opportunities along with a more vibrant economy, resulting in greater dynamic revenue generation to reduce the deficit and improve our nation's fiscal standing. The strong, progrowth fiscal policies in the TCJA resulted in strong economic growth, which was derailed by the Biden/Schumer/Pelosi policies that are now in place. The TCJA reflected our goal of delivering meaningful, pro-growth tax reform. Preservation of the integrity of our borders is essential to immigration policy as well as our national security. Second, our immigration system must not grant amnesty to those who enter our country illegally or illegally overstay their visas. No person who breaks the law should obtain any benefit toward either permanent legal residency or citizenship as a result of their illegal conduct. This is unfair both to American citizens and to those who have gone through legal channels for immigration to the U.S. Third, non-citizens must not be afforded the means-tested, federal benefits available to U.S. citizens. Federal public benefit programs exist as a manifestation of the American aspiration to take care of our own less fortunate. In today's fiscal climate, the solvency of these programs is ill-fated at best, making it nothing less than irresponsible to exacerbate 	a. Is working in the fields merit based? Our country was the first in the history of the world to have a written, national constitution that was ratified by its people and is binding on the government. It set the U.S. apart from all other nations, and placed us in a leadership role regarding democracy and governance "of the people, by the people and for the people". Abraham Lincoln spoke those words, and he understood what our Founding Fathers had in mind – that the Constitution set forth enduring ideals, ideals which have stood the test of time. The Constitution itself provides for a process of constitutional amendments. The first amendments to this sacred document were the Bill of Rights that were ratified at the same time as the Constitution itself. There is a process for amending the Constitution when the citizens of the United States of America believe it should be amended, but that process is by design difficult and onerous and requires an extraordinary amount of agreement among the people. The fact that it is difficult to amend the Constitution (only 27 amendments in over 200 years) is a testament to the foresight and insight of our Founders.	a.
