14. What is your background and why do you feel it qualifies you for this position?	After living 72 years on this planet, I have learned a few things and have a wealth of varied experiences. Foremost among these is that I have been a City Council member for the past four years. I have not missed a single regularly scheduled council meeting these past four years.  Add to that, experience gained through military service as a combat veteran in Vietnam where I conducted surveillance and intelligence duties. I worked in the national space program for thirty-four years where I conducted basic science research and managed two earth-orbiting satellite instruments that monitored the atmosphere. During the last thirteen years of my NASA career, I also taught at a community college in the geography department. I earned an Associate, Bachelor, and Masters academic degrees, many of the graduate credits in the urban studies department. I have also qualified for and been a member in Mensa.  All of this experience has served as training which allows me to analyze data quickly, cut through the fat and get to the 'bottom line' easily, determine what is most important, and to 'think for myself' allowing me to make a reasoned, logical decision. I do not answer to any established, recognized political party. I answer only to God and the Rathdrum constituency, both those who voted for me and those who did not.		Through many years of management and sales background I have learned to be a very good listener. The 17 years that I've lived in Rathdrum I've watched and learned and listened to the people and I understand their feelings and I want to be a deciding factor in helping them. Problems exist, and I don't have all the answers, but with the other fellow council members and myself I want to help come up with solutions to those problems without overburdening the citizens.
