1. What is your name, what office are you running for and why are you running for this position?	<b>No Response Received</b>	My name is Jordan Redman, and I am running for re-election for Legislative District 3, Seat B Representative. What do you consider the biggest health care issue for Idaho, and where do you stand on it?	<b>No Response Received</b>	I consider the biggest health care issue for Idaho is the need for Medicaid reform. I sponsored legislation last year to work on this issue and will be continuing to push for much needed reforms. The Medicaid budget last year was the largest budget our state has ever seen (surpassing the Education budget) and has many areas of improvement that we can make. I believe we need to have a healthy and sustainable welfare program for the State of Idaho and it's most vulnerable in-need citizens that isn't abusing or mis-using taxpayer dollars, but is stewarding them well.
5. Idaho's school system has room for improvement, how would you legislate to improve K-12 education in Idaho?	<b>No Response Received</b>	School-choice will be a top-priority issue coming into the next legislative session. I will be supporting legislation for school-choice, and education funding following the child. I also am in support of removing DEI ideologies from our public schools.

Do you support or oppose legislation to prohibit gender reassignment treatment/surgery on minors?	<b>No Response Received</b>	I support legislation to prohibit gender reassignment treatment/surgery on minors. I co-sponsored and voted in favor of HB668 which prohibited public funds from being used toward these treatments and surgeries on minors.

<b>10.</b> What legislation should be passed regarding School Choice?	<b>No Response Received</b>	I believe that school-choice will be a big issue in this next legislative session and I am hopeful we can make some great improvements to our current public education system. I believe an ESA (Education Savings Account) program for education funding would be ideal but I am also on board with a tax credit system as well if that is the only thing that we can get passed through. I believe that the education tax dollars should follow the child, rather than the dollars going directly and only to the school districts.
<b>11.</b> What legislation would you recommend to prevent property tax increases that are causing a financial burden and forcing some owners out of their homes?	<b>No Response Received</b>	I am in favor of legislation that limits the frequency of levies being ran in order to temper the add-ons on already high tax amounts. I am also in favor of an increase on homeowners tax credits for homes being resided in as a primary home.
