Supporting strong conservative candidates, election integrity and voter confidence is greatly needed. I believe that there are many efforts to overturn the republican party into a diluted republican or a more liberal republican party that doesn't align with our true conservative values.	My top priorities are sustainable planning and fiscal responsibility. We need a state that functions.
<b>8.</b> Are you willing to hold party leaders and candidates accountable to stay focused on principle over compromise? How will you do this?	Yes—accountability is essential. Principles are what give the party its identity and trust with voters, and without them, we lose both credibility and direction. While compromise can be necessary in governing, it should never come at the expense of core values. I'd support candidates and leaders who publicly commit to core conservative principles. Maintain regular, direct communication with elected officials and party leadership. Keep precinct members and voters informed about key decisions and votes. Use the influence of the central committee to back candidates who uphold principles. Promote a party culture where standing on principle is expected, not optional.
